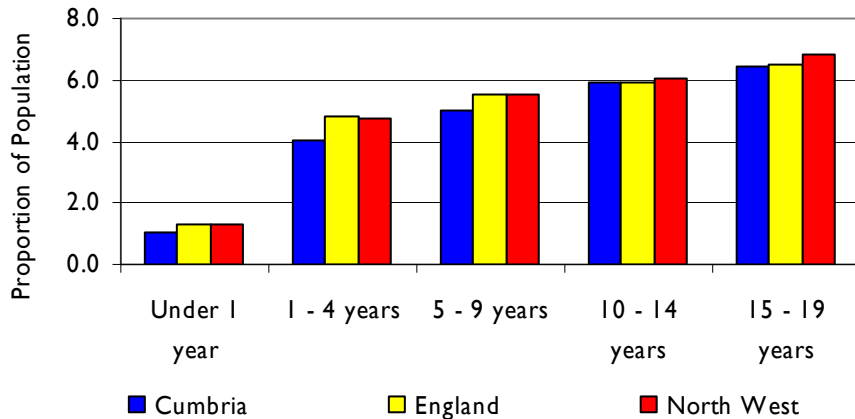


CUMBRIA - Children and Young People

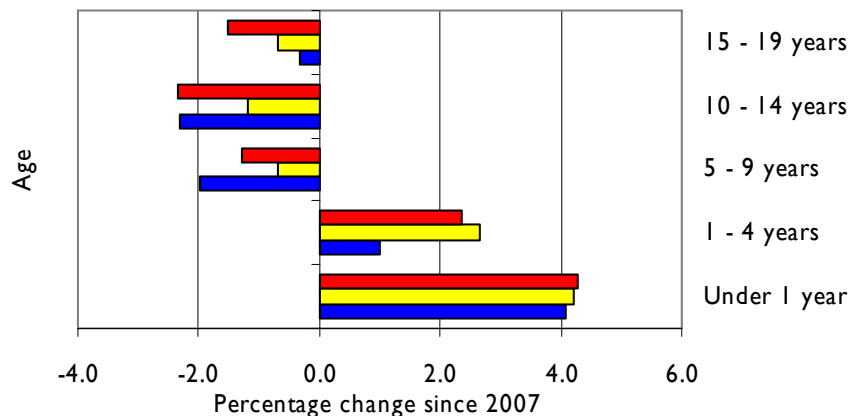

- Overall, the population of 0-19 year olds in Cumbria decreased by 900 between 2007 and 2008 (-0.8% decrease);
- The greatest decrease was in the 10-14 age group (-2.3%);
- There were also decreases in the 5-9 age group (-2%) and the 15-19 age group (-0.3%);
- The population of younger children in Cumbria (0-4 year olds) increased by 400 between 2007 and 2008;
- The greatest increase was in children aged under 1 year (+4.1%);
- Cumbria has a marginally smaller proportion of children in each age group than the North West and England;
- An increase in children in younger age groups and a decrease in children in older age groups was also seen at a regional and national level between 2007 and 2008;
- Barrow-in-Furness had the largest proportion of 0-19 year olds while South Lakeland had the smallest proportion;
- South Lakeland also experienced the greatest decrease in 0-19 year olds (-2.6%);
- Carlisle experienced a significant increase in children aged under 1 year (+9.1%).
