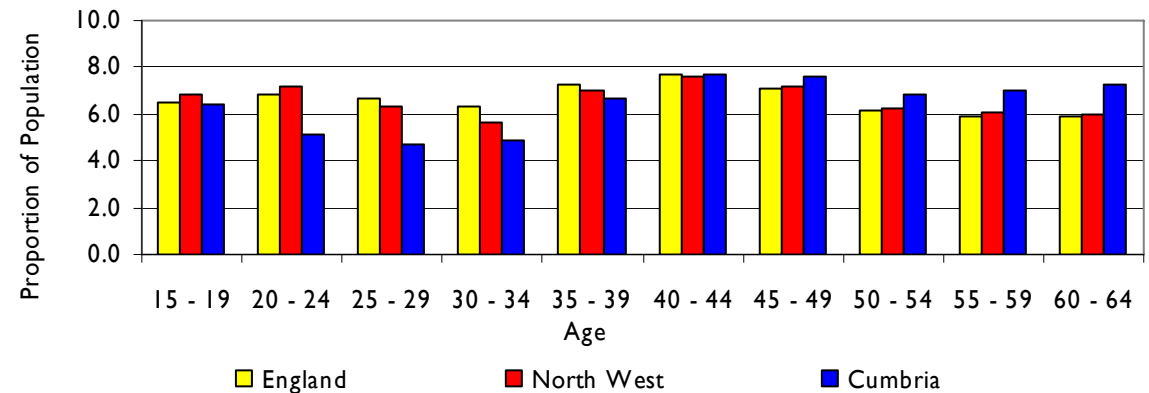


CUMBRIA – Working Age Population

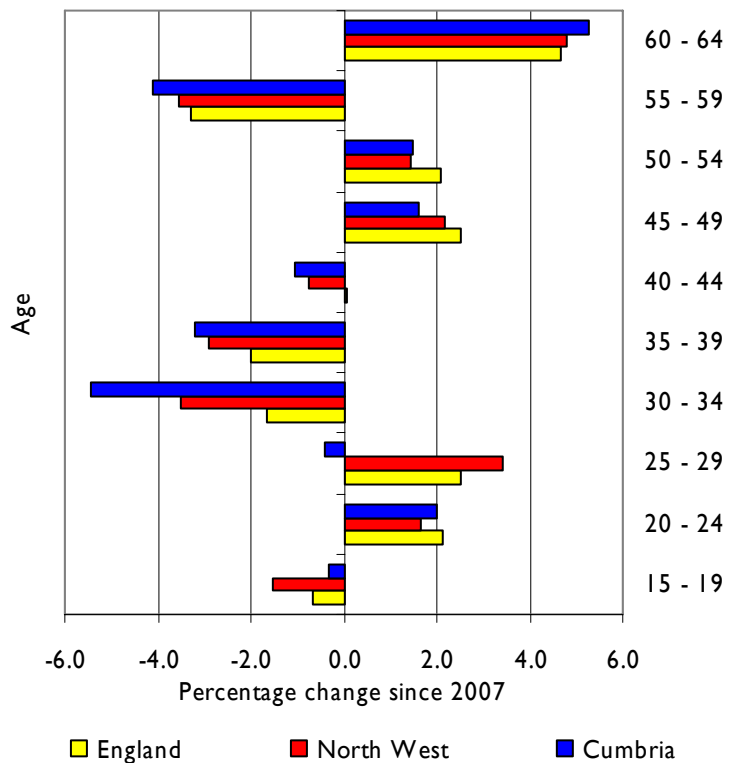
- Overall, the population of residents aged 15 to 64 years in Cumbria decreased by 1,200 between 2007 and 2008 (a decrease of -0.4%);
- The greatest decrease was in the 30 to 34 age group (-5.4%);
- The greatest increase was in the 60-64 age group (+5.2%);
- Cumbria has a smaller proportion of residents the younger working age groups and a higher proportion of residents in the older working age groups when compared to the North West and England;
